I became actively involved with the Foundation for Belmont Education soon after it was founded. I felt honored to be part of its Board of Directors, a group of talented and dedicated people from throughout the Belmont community who were deeply committed to public education. The late Frank Aguilar and Ellen Stevens, served as the first and second Presidents of the Foundation, respectively.

In these early years, the Board was energized by the challenges of raising funds and developing programs to ensure that grants awarded to the schools would have the greatest impact. Encouraged by extraordinary support from the community, we added walkathons, spelling bees (both for adults and children), major gift solicitation, and a fundraising dinner to our initial annual appeal for donations. As our fundraising capacity increased, we were able to build upon our small (Learning Excellence) grants program to take on more ambitious projects, hard to fund from the regular school budget. These included: renovating the foreign language laboratory at the high school, purchasing a portable planetarium to support the science curriculum, piloting the first classroom SMART Board™, and providing designated funds for professional staff development. Those years were exhilarating, rewarding, and just plain fun.

As gratifying as working on the Foundation was back then, it is even more gratifying to see all that has been accomplished by the efforts of so many people since then. Congratulations! Good luck with your annual appeal this year and all that you are planning for the future.

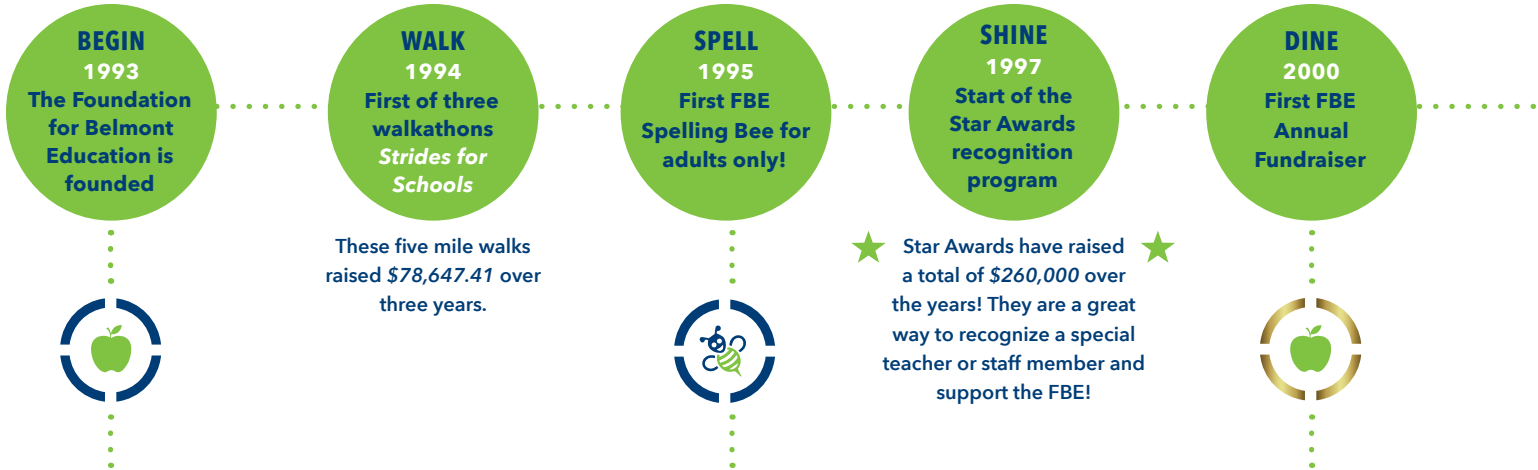

The FBE was created to support and sustain enrichment programs offered in the Belmont Public Schools at a time when spending per pupil was decreasing, and valuable programs were vulnerable. Generous family donations in the early 1990s made the work of the FBE possible.

Hosted in the BHS cafeteria, 36 teams competed, with the *Powers Music School team* winning. The winning word was *Jibboom*, and the event raised over \$13,000 for the Belmont Public Schools. Belmont Savings Bank was our corporate sponsor for this FBE event, and their generous support continued over the next 25 years.

Today, the FBE Spelling Bee attracts close to 800 spellers, from Kindergarten to 6th grade, and raises over \$20,000 annually.

Our first Annual Fundraising Dinner, the brainchild of Ellen Sullivan who organized an army of people to put on this event, was held in March 2000. Nearly 400 people gathered in the Hellenic Cultural Center in Watertown to show their support for the Belmont Public Schools.

There have been 20 Annual Fundraising Dinners since, with an array of themes, from 'Mad for Education' to 'Roaring 20s'. These dinners have become the FBE's largest fundraising effort.

TARGETED CAMPAIGNS

1995 BHS LANGUAGE LAB

The FBE's first grant was awarded to Belmont High School for a language lab. This \$52,000+ grant was in conjunction with a donation from the BHS PTO.



2003 FRIENDS OF SCIENCE

A large, focused campaign that raised \$65,000 and solicited material donations valued at more than \$15,000 to replace and update science equipment at Belmont High School.

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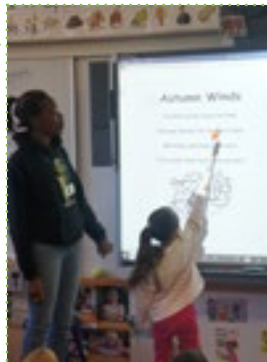
The Dan Scharfman Memorial Run was named in honor of Dan Scharfman, a pillar of the Belmont community. Mr. Scharfman was an elected member of the Belmont School Committee and Belmont Town Meeting, and was a tireless advocate for the Belmont Public Schools.

In 2019, at the request of the Scharfman family, the Run was renamed to solely focus on education in Belmont. It is now called the FBE Apple Run - Belmont Runs for Education!

We honored this important milestone with a gift of \$25,000 to the High School, Middle School, and Elementary Schools, for a total gift of \$75,000.

2008-2011 T3 CAMPAIGN

This significant campaign created 21st century classrooms for interactive learning by installing SMART Board™ technology in grades 4-12 and upgrading the BHS language lab. We funded the \$600,000 installation of more than 100 SMART Boards, and the comprehensive professional development for teachers. Teachers have embraced the technology, providing robust, efficient learning experiences for all our students.



2014-2017 INNOVATIVE TEACHING INITIATIVE

The Innovative Teaching Initiative provided \$450,000 over four years to fund grants geared toward innovative teaching practices. Funds were used to support teachers as they honed new teaching techniques, utilized technology in new ways and developed unique curricula. Funds were also used for technology tools such as iPads.



FBE PROGRAM COMMITTEE

The FBE Program Committee is responsible for reviewing all grant applications submitted by Belmont Public School teachers, staff, and administrators. The committee is comprised of the Vice President of Programs, sixteen volunteer community members, and one Belmont High School student representative. The members are each assigned as a liaison to one of the town's six schools as well as to seven subject areas including English, Fine Arts, Foreign Language, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Technology. The committee currently meets three times each school year to consider: Learning Excellence Grant Program applications for curriculum and classroom enrichment (fall and early spring), and Innovative Teaching Initiative applications for professional development (late spring). Funding is subject to availability, and partial grants may be awarded.

SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING & CULTURALLY RESPONSIVE TEACHING

This district-wide initiative began with a \$25,000 FBE grant to help the BPS build its Social Emotional Learning (SEL) competencies. Each school invited teachers to join a school steering committee, whose members attended summer institutes to learn all aspects of social emotional learning including brain research and how to implement SEL through classroom and schoolwide practices, direction instruction, infusion into the curriculum, school-based events, and family engagement. Steering committee members led professional development for their colleagues during professional development time in the fall of 2015 and 2017 as well as faculty meetings during the year. The district SEL programming expanded to include professional development work to address achievement gaps and give focus to becoming more culturally responsive educators. This included speakers and workshops from IDEAS (Initiatives for Developing Equity and Achievement for Students) in 2017 and 2018. To date, the FBE has given more than \$175,000 in support of SEL for all our Belmont Public School students and staff.

MEMORABLE GRANTS

1996 MUSICIAN IN RESIDENCE

Renowned composer, Gunther Schuller, worked with Belmont High School musicians to create an original piece of music. This program was funded in part by POMS and private fundraising in addition to the \$2,500 FBE grant.

1998 STARLAB PLANETARIUM

The FBE funded a \$22,000 StarLab Portable Planetarium. The StarLab blows up into a 20-foot-diameter hemisphere to hold 35 to 40 students. It is a primary teaching tool for science, has cross-curricular benefits, and is a highlight of the Chenery Middle School curriculum to this day.

2014 BURBANK GARDEN PROJECT

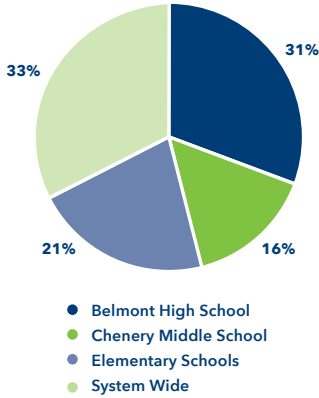
The goal was to transform an underused school area into an attractive garden for hands-on learning and exploration. The garden includes a butterfly habitat created with perennial plants, raised beds for growing Colonial-era herbs, and a teepee trellis for pole beans. A weather station was installed on the school roof, with weather data always available to classrooms.

2019 DIVERSITY DAY

The FBE supported Diversity Day at Belmont High School, awarding funds for visiting artist, Darrell Gane McCalla, who provided an interactive art workshop on social concerns and diversity. An additional \$850 was provided for the day's 'Hunger Banquet'.

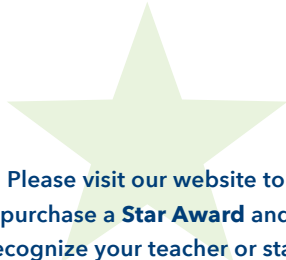
